A NOTE FROM THE DEAN

I am sorry to be absent (again!) on a Sunday morning. In a surprise to us all, The Three Cantors have been 'reconstituted' (albeit briefly) for a concert in, of all places, Churchill, MB last evening. Churchill is the northern most parish in the Diocese of Brandon (Bishop Bill Cliff!) and is a community which has been through the mill over rail lines and other distance related issues. It is a pleasure for us to be able to sing for them, and to be able to worship with them this morning! You are all in my prayers.



On May 19, Bishop Rob Hardwick of the Diocese of Qu'Appelle will embark on a 7,877 km cycling pilgrimage through 21 dioceses, praying for unity, healing and reconciliation as he rides. His goal is to raise over \$800,000 for The Anglican Church of Canada's Indigenous ministry.

On Saturday, June 30, Bishop Hardwick will be undertaking a special cycling trip from our Cathedral to St. James Cathedral in Toronto, as part of his cross Canada tour. We hope to create a team of cyclists from Niagara and Toronto to companion Bishop Hardwick on this leg of his journey, and raise funds for healing and reconciliation ministries.
