

til December 9th.



# CHRIST'S CHURCH CATHEDRAL

## A Place of Community, Compassion, and Hope

### OUR WORSHIP TEAM LEADERS

Christ's Church Cathedral utilizes a team approach to plan, organize and coordinate worship services, strengthen our identity and build community. There are four principal teams, each comprised of parishioners and led by lay people. Team Leaders work closely with clergy and staff to involve as many parishioners as possible in the liturgical life of the parish. Team Leaders manage their own schedules and link with other teams as best suits their needs. They meet periodically with clergy and staff to plan special services and refine procedures, update team lists, refine examples, and assist with training. Team lists are published in the service booklet each week.

#### Team Leaders:

- Help to develop a sense of community in the team and throughout the entire parish
- Schedule team members for liturgical duties on the dates assigned
- Advise Cathedral staff of service rosters well in advance of the service
- Ensure that team members are present in the church to carry out their duties
- Find or fill in for absences as necessary (members are normally expected to find their own replacements)
- Help train team members and encourage attendance at training sessions
- In consultation with clergy, staff and other team members, invite new members of the community to be part of a team.
- Update team lists and distribute to team members, other team leaders, and the office.
- Meet from time to time with clergy, staff, and other team leaders to review duties and issues.

#### Worship Team Leaders should have:

- Good communication skills
- Regular attendance at services
- Familiarity with the flow of the liturgy and worship service
- Good knowledge of our building and facilities
- Sincere interest the growth and development of the Cathedral community

Our objective is to include everyone on a team; however you are under no obligation to take on duties you feel unable to perform. Remember that our teams always need your prayers!

## HOW MUCH SHOULD I GIVE?

When you give generously to the mission and ministries of the church and to those less fortunate, you'll discover it's an investment in your own spirituality and happiness.

But the question often asked is "how much?" We suggest you determine an appropriate level of giving in proportion to your income. The **Proportional Giving Chart** below will help you to determine your gift.

If you are not already giving proportionally, we suggest you prayerfully consider giving two percent or more of your income to the Cathedral this year. That's a good place to start. If you are already giving proportionally we hope you will consider generously increasing your gift by a percentage point or two for 2019.

For your convenience you can give by Pre-Authorized Payments, through weekly envelopes, or by special gifts and memorials. We keep accurate and confidential records of your contributions, and we'll send you periodic and annual statements to facilitate your tax preparation.

### BUILDING THE CATHEDRAL COMMUNITY OF THE FUTURE

A Planned Gift is a way of contributing to the mission and ministry of the church from your accumulated assets. It is a deferred gift – you decide now how you would like your assets to be used later.

The most popular form of Planned Giving is a bequest – you simply include a gift to the Church in your will e.g. Christ's Church Cathedral, the Primate's World Relief and Development Fund, the Anglican Foundation, etc.

If you know how you would like the gift to be used, be specific, e.g. Cathedral outreach, maintenance of stained glass windows, etc.

There are other ways to plan your response to God's generosity in your life. Some Planned Gifts may provide tax benefits today, others can give you a guaranteed income for life, and some enable you to give a significant future gift at a modest present cost. As a good steward you will want to make sure any gift is well protected, well managed, and used for things you support.

Decisions on these matters are a very personal and important part of your overall financial planning. Your Rector, Wardens, accountant, lawyer or financial planner can provide more information.
