
- our excellent outreach programs

- being the best we can be in ministries, music, liturgy, preaching, and Christian education




Please take a few moments to review the following charts which detail the budgeted amounts allocated to each of our major ministry areas, and the sources of our funding.

First, our Total Budgeted Investment in Ministries (our expenses) in 2018 is expected to be \$554,575.

And here is a breakdown of our expected **Sources of Income (totalling \$540,100)** in 2018:



Our 2018 budget was a deficit budget, meaning that if we get the income anticipated and expenses are in line with the 2018 budget, we will end the year with a \$14,475 deficit (income of \$540,100 minus expenses of \$554,575).

This deficit can be covered by an accumulated surplus from prior years, but we are concerned that with year-to-date givings not meeting our 2% planned increase as approved by Vestry for 2018, we will end the 2018 year with a deficit higher than planned which may place a strain on our operations in 2019.
