STEWARDSHIP

In churches, the word *Stewardship* sometimes is only associated with money. But it's about much more than money – it is a word used to describe the **responsible overseeing and protection** of something considered worth caring for and preserving.

As good stewards of Christ's Church Cathedral, we *practice stewardship* in a variety of ways. We work hard at:

- Being the best we can be in ministries, music, liturgy, preaching, and Christian education
- Regularly and thoughtfully considering our mission and ministries in the community
- Being hospitable and welcoming
- Being actively involved in the community
- Continually clarifying our needs
- Clearly communicating our financial situation
- Caring for our resources, facilities, and the environment

Christian Stewardship goes even further – it is based on understanding that all we have is a gift to us from God. Christian stewards believe that when we give, we're giving back to God what belongs to God in the first place. Christian Stewardship calls for regular and generous giving of our time, talent, and treasure. Learning about how to be good stewards of God's gifts and about the kind of life where we're trusting God with all that we are, have, and give is a lifelong, year-round activity.

BISHOPSGATE – AN EXAMPLE OF GOOD STEWARDSHIP.

Because of the vision and generosity of one parishioner, we have a beautiful garden in front of the Cathedral providing much needed green space and beauty for our neighbourhood. Created in cooperation with the Diocese of Niagara, **Bishopsgate** is a gift to the local community. A team of dedicated gardeners give their time and talent to maintain this wonderful space for all to enjoy.

Bishopsgate is meant to be a shared place. The benches are an invitation to sit and enjoy God's beauty around you – the water feature, the magnificent gardens in bloom, the architecture of the building, and the neighbourhood itself.

Bishopsgate also hosts a variety of outreach and social events. During fair weather months, Makers' Market vendors use the space to display their wares and during Art Crawls, the space just hums with people, music, and sounds of the city. Occasionally, we hold an outdoor church service in Bishopsgate. Whether you're looking for a moment of peace and tranquility or a convenient meeting spot, Bishopsgate exists for your enjoyment."




