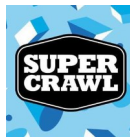
**Please pray for the following people during the week.** (Names remain on the list for one month. Please submit a new prayer request after that period of time if necessary.)

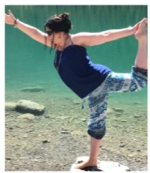
